PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The H.I.T. Program is centered on skills and leadership identity training for female professors from all disciplines across Switzerland. The program is structured around training modules, individual coaching, professional networking, peer mentoring and leadership shadowing.

Several training modules and workshops led by internationally well-known experts in academic leadership will be organized at several locations in Switzerland: Lucerne, Neuchâtel and Bern.

We will invite role models – female leaders from universities, federal agencies and bodies responsible for higher education and research policies – and change agents, to discuss current issues in higher education in Switzerland. Our invited guests will give practical advice and share scenarios from their own careers to inspire the participants.

The participants in the program will gain knowledge and skills, build new connections and develop their professional networks, and ultimately be prepared for senior academic leadership roles in the future.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Twenty places are available for female full or associate professors from cantonal and federal Swiss universities, who are interested in academic leadership positions at faculty or university management levels.

The online application opens on Monday, 12 July 2021 and closes on Friday, 20 August 2021. Due to limited places, a selection process will take place. The final candidates, selected by the program selection committee with members from all partner universities, will be notified before 15 September 2021.

The registration fee for the participants in the program is CHF 2'000 and includes access to all training sessions, course materials, lunches, coffee breaks, as well as dinner and accommodation for the 2-day leadership retreat in Neuchâtel.
